MARK ZACCARIA OF NORTH KINGSTOWN ANNOUNCES BID TO CHALLENGE CONGRESSMAN JIM LANGEVIN

Mark Zaccaria, an independent business owner from North Kingstown, is today announcing his bid to challenge U.S Representative Jim Langevin for Congress in the Second Congressional District.

“Congressman Langevin is a good person who suffered a debilitating injury in a terrible accident as a young man and should be commended for overcoming that and for his public service,” Zaccaria says. “His bias in favor of Big Government and his willingness to fund increased bureaucracy through tax mandates is the problem.”

“Congressman Langevin has served in the Rhode Island House, and the U.S. House, but I don't think he really understands the problems you face in YOUR house.”

“People across this country, and certainly in Rhode Island, are losing their houses, they are suffering from a colossal housing market collapse. Congress seems incapable of addressing the underlying economic issues in a timely way. Solutions are needed now and people losing their houses on

your block or in your neighborhood can't wait for endless committee hearings in Washington to get help.”

Zaccaria, who grew up in a Boston suburb, has lived in Rhode Island for a Decade. He and his wife Ruth have three grown children. He presently owns Rustin Marketing Services, an Outsource Agency for Business to Business Marketing programs and content. He spent nine years at Zebra Technologies International, in Warwick, as a channel marketing executive for that U.S manufacturing company.

“Over the course of my life, I have been a military man, a family man and a businessman. I fell in love with this state as a child, so I jumped at the chance to root my family here when I got the opportunity. But like so many Rhode Islanders, I worry about the future of this beautiful state and the fiscal problems hurting families here cannot all be solved at the RI Statehouse. Soaring health care costs are bankrupting families and young people in our state and there is a responsibility in the U.S. House that is not being met.”

Zaccaria cites Congressman Langevin's recent co-sponsorship of a Universal Health Care bill (bill number - - -) as an example of the ineffectiveness of his vision of how government should work.

“A Universal Health Care bill is a feel good piece of legislation. It won't accomplish its objectives. Among other problems with the bill, by most accounts it will not address the costly and complicated dilemma of illegals' access to health care. It also does not provide for the organizational structure that would be needed to implement it. Soaring health care costs and co-pays will not be resolved in his bill.”

Zaccaria says he is running a grassroots fundraising effort to finance his campaign for Congress. He is an active member of the state GOP, NK GOP and has served on the NK Town Council.
